Dear Friends of Tyburn Monastery,

However, on the 8th of June when NZ moved to Level 1, approximately twelve or thirteen guests came to stay at our retreat centre and generously offered to help with the 40 Hours adoration. Rev. Fr. John Roberts also stayed at our retreat centre and concelebrated Holy Mass with our Chaplain each day and on Corpus Christi Sunday he led the Eucharistic Procession after Mass. The weather on Corpus Christi Sunday turned out to be one of the best we ever had and to our surprise, more than a hundred people turned up for the Mass and the Procession.

Those who were present at this unique event were able to view a DVD documentary with clips of the different scenes of Mother Angela's life which our oblate Agnes Lim had cleverly compiled.

On the 12th of September, everyone in our Community was present for the ceremony of the unveiling and blessing of Mother M. Angela's(RIP) headstone at Ngakuru. The Solemn Mass commenced at 11am and it was presided over by Rev. Fr. John Roberts, with deacon Joe Rogers assisting him. Approximately 40 people turned up for the occasion, most of whom were friends and oblates of both our communities. At the conclusion of Mass, we all went in procession to the cemetery with Rev. Fr. John leading the five decades of the Glorious Mysteries of the Holy Rosary on our way there. The ceremony soon began and the highlight of it was when the lovely granite headstone with its exquisite inscriptions and photo of M. M. Angela was unveiled. This beautiful ceremony, tinged with a palpable sense of loss will be forever etched in our memories.

On the 20th of September, Rev. Mother M. Lucy who was formerly our Sub-Prioress was officially installed as our new Mother Prioress while Rev. Mother Philippa-Mary replaced her as Sub-Prioress.

On the 26th of September, our Oblates Elisapeta and her husband Winn renewed the marriage vows of their 50th Anniversary during our Conventual Mass. The beautiful ceremony was presided over by our Chaplain, Rev. Fr. Arobati and the couple's family were present for this joyous event.

From the 9th till the 16th of October, we had our Annual Retreat. This year, Rev Fr. John Roberts gave us a preached retreat for 5 days beginning on the 12th of October and at the end of our Retreat, our Oblates had their turn on the 17th with Father giving them

Then on the evening of the 23rd after our priest retreatants had left, ten ladies who were ex-students from St. Mary College in Samoa also came for a weekend retreat. During their stay, they did adoration for two nights and sang beautifully at Holy Mass on Sunday.

Two of our dear Oblates passed to the Lord recently; Maria Mascaranhas on the 3rd of October and Hilary Adams in early November. We continue to pray for the repose of their souls and that God may console their bereaved ones.
