Do you feel called to share in the Eucharistic
Adoration of the Benedictine Nuns?

You are invited to join the Tyburn Association of Adoration in day and night adoration before the Blessed Sacrament Exposed. There is urgent need to spend time with Jesus “in Adoration and in contemplation that is full of faith and ready to make reparation for the great faults and crimes of the world” (Dominicae Cenae no. 3), and to pray in a special way for Priests: for their sanctification and perseverance, and for an increase in vocation to the priesthood in Scotland.

Rules of the Association

1. Each member will take his or her turn, at least once in two months in the rota for night adoration at the Benedictine Monastery, Largs. If anyone is legitimately prevented from making the vigil at the monastery, he or she should make at least one hours prayer in some other church or at home.
2. During the vigil in addition to making reparation for the faults and sins of the world and praying for priests, each member will pray for the intentions of the Adorers of the the Sacred Heart of Jesus of Montmartre.
3. Members are expected to attend the general meetings and annual eucharistic retreats held at the Benedictine Monastery.
4. On the Saturday after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, the Act of Consecration will be renewed by the whole group at the monastery. Any member unable to be present will renew the Act privately in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

Admission

1. Application should be made to Mother Prioress who alone has authority to admit members.

2. Candidates are put on probation for one year to study the spirit of the Association.
3. After this year, the candidate makes the Act of Consecration and is admitted to full membership.

Privileges

1. All members of the Association have a daily remembrance in the prayers and share in the good works of the Benedictine Nuns.
2. On the Saturday after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, a Mass is offered at the Benedictine Monastery and at Tyburn for all the members of the Association.
3. On the first free Saturday in November, a mass is offered at the Benedictine Monastery and at Tyburn for the repose of the souls of all deceased members of the Association.

Exceptions

1. Candidates who have long been lay adorers at the Benedictine Monastery will be exempted from the one year probation.
2. Temporary exceptions from any rules can be granted by the organizing secretary.
3. Permanent exceptions require in addition the authorization of Mother Prioress.
