We commenced this year beautifully with the Solemnity of the Mother of God, imploring her to guide and protect Her children in all the vicissitudes of life, as she being the best of Mothers, is ever solicitous for their welfare. On New Year Eve, some of our lay adorers did a whole night vigil before the Blessed Sacrament and since then, they have continued coming on every first Friday of the month.

Then from the beginning of January till the end of February, we had a busy retreat centre with many guests coming and going and of course most weekends were booked out. The Bonds of Marian Love came for a weekend retreat from the 15th-17th of February. A couple who came for the retreat had their baby baptised in our Church after Holy Mass on Sunday to the joy of her parents.

We welcomed Helen from California on the 5th of March. She stayed with us till the 9th, during which time she was able to explore our Monastery and its grounds and to meet our Community before going to our Monastery at Ngakuru to enter there as a postulant.

On the 16th of March, a group of about 30 people with their organizer, John Mills spent the day at our Monastery to celebrate the opening of the new Secondary School, St Ignatius of Loyola in Drury. They concluded with Holy Mass at 5pm, celebrated by Rev. Fr. Chris Gleeson in our Church which we all attended.

Rev. Fr. John Roberts came for a 10 - day retreat commencing on the Saturday before Passion Sunday till Easter Tuesday, and during his stay, he concelebrated the Conventual Mass daily with our Chaplain, Rev. Fr. Arobati. We are glad that he was able to accompany us spiritually through this important period of the liturgical year with his inspiring homilies.

On Good Friday, at the Commemoration of Our Lord's Passion, there was an enormous turnout of more than 400 people, overflowing outside the Church entrance. The weather was perfect and everyone could assemble outside in the car park

Earlier this summer, he planted a wide assortment of vegetables and soon we had a good crop of savoy and red cabbages, cucumbers, capsicums, courgettes, lettuces, spring onions, chives, potatoes and tomatoes. Recently he has been working on a large newly constructed vegetable patch and now there are already a lot of young vegetables growing in it, some ready to be harvested.

Since the chicks have all grown up, they are now able to move around freely among the other adult chickens within their enclosure.
