Dear Friends,



"I have come to cast fire upon the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled!"

This is the English translation of the Latin words engraved on our Congregation medal, which we receive when we make our Vows. They surround an image of the Lord Jesus pointing to His Sacred Heart, from which emanates a blazing flame. When Jesus said these words, it is clear from the Gospel passage that He knew this fire would be kindled when He would suffer His passion and His Heart would be pierced with the lance, because this fire is His redeeming charity with which He took on Himself our sinfulness and made a way to freedom for us. The opening paragraph of our Congregation Charism states: "The Heart of our Saviour... is also the source of that love which the Holy Spirit pours out upon all the members of His Mystical Body". Through many great saints throughout the centuries, notably St Margaret Mary Alacoque, Jesus has made clear to each successive generation that the fire has been kindled and is blazing – it remains for us to carry it to every corner of the world! To our Foundress the Servant of God Mother Marie Adele Garnier, He revealed the simplest and surest means of transmitting this fire of Divine Charity: Exposition of His Heart living and present in the Holy Eucharist, perpetually adored in the centre of Churches and Chapels, waiting for every broken and needy Soul to come and be set on fire.

In the past 18 months we have been overwhelmed by an atmosphere of fear on account of a spreading virus. We have kept our distances from one another, since it is from person to person we are told that it is spread. Yet here is something that spreads from person to person, heart to heart, which we have **no need to fear**: The fire of encounter with Divine Love! We must as a matter of urgency reflect on this call to be set ablaze, particularly through Adoration of the Holy Eucharist. We need to believe not only with our lips but with our whole being that the Eucharistic Jesus is capable of healing us, protecting us, instructing us, turning our lives around and making us shining witnesses of Truth and Love to those who we meet. All we need to do is present ourselves before Him with our hearts open like His.

Why is fire a symbol of love? Fire can be so destructive! So can the false love which is not contained within the furnace of Divine Charity: Not contained within the Heart, the Will, the desires of God. The fire of this Divine furnace, however, has the power to warm, to melt, to light up and to burn away impurity.

Day by day and on many a night our community prays in the presence of the blazing, radiant, Eucharistic Heart of Jesus on behalf of each one of you, but we also pray for the extension of the

reign of the Sacred Heart – May Exposition of the Holy Eucharistic flourish once again in Parishes and chapels so that all may have the opportunity to Adore! May our children be taught once more to believe with all their minds and hearts in the Real Presence of Jesus. If they are given this one gift, they will have all they need to endure the trials of our times.

Strengthened and consoled by this Divine Presence, our community has put its' best foot forward in developing our Monastery's potential for self-sustainability as best we can. The Bible Garden is looking better by the day. A new project was taken on by the **local YMCA group**, who have been working a day each week on Hezekiah's Garden and Isaiah's Vineyard. It has given them great joy and satisfaction and given a very needed and healthy break from their online courses. A recent **Council Town Development Fund grant** has also facilitated the renovation of the Garden of the Song which our volunteers are working on. The bulb planting carried out last autumn produced a magnificent avenue of daffodils lining the pathway up to Our Lady's Grotto. **Our thanks go to the Manager of Lidl Ireland Cobh** for the gift of a new lawnmower, seen here as she hands it over to Dan and Paschal and some of our community. **Thanks also to Diarmud O'Connor of East Cork Sand and Gravel**, for the generous donation of several tonnes of gravel.
