




Faith, Hope Charity And Christmas.

Rev. Fr. Patrick Cope, R.I.P.

Our dear chaplain, Rev. Fr. Patrick Cope, died on 21st October here at Tyburn Convent. He was only 59. It was Rev. Fr. Patrick's wish to come home to Tyburn to be with his sisters during his last days on earth. Most of our professed sisters were gathered around him praying the prayers for the dying. It was very peaceful. Rev. Fr. Patrick was diagnosed with cancer about two months before he died and his decline was very rapid. He bore his illness with great faith and courage to the very end. Father Patrick's remains were received into our Chapel for a vigil service on 3rd November and remained in the sanctuary until the 6th, when his body was moved to St George's Cathedral in Southwark for a Requiem Mass. Father's body was taken to Sacred Heart Church in Hull for a funeral Mass on the 9th, followed by burial at Eastern Cemetery. May he rest in peace.
