The 3rd October marked a very historic occasion in the history of our Congregation and indeed for the history of the Church. Reverend Fathers Manuel T. Agudelo Marin and Hector F. Nagles Santa, from Colombia, began their novitiate. Father Manuel received the religious name of Father Benedict Mary of the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus and Father Hector was named Father Bernard Mary of the Sacred Heart. After a few months' formation at Tyburn Convent,



they will return to their own country, Colombia, to continue their journey. In Colombia, the monks do not yet have a monastery, only have a plot of land for its construction. They are placing their hope in Divine Providence, and in St. Joseph, whose name the future monastery will bear. The monks are trusting in Divine Providence and the intercession of St Joseph to move souls and hearts to help us them with prayers and material aid, to build Our Lord a beautiful sanctuary, a throne where the Blessed Sacrament will be seated, and there to worship Him and make reparation for so many sins and offenses that are committed daily against his adorable Eucharistic presence.
